- Time: Less than 30 minutes
- Mess Level: Messy

Materials Needed:

Pumpkin Pulp
Seable Bag
Marker Pen
Spiders or Other Small Toys That Interest Children



Step-by-Step Instructions:

1. Decorate your sealable bag: Draw facial features and expressions on the bag, which can be either spooky or cute.



2. Scoop out the pumpkin pulp (keeping the seeds) and put it into the sealable bag. You can also add some spiders or other small toys for children to find.



3. Seal the bag, and your pumpkin sensory bag is ready!



4. The pumpkin pulp is soft and juicy, providing children with a unique tactile experience. This tactile stimulation can help children develop their sensory integration skills and enhance their ability to perceive and distinguish different textures.



The Science Behind It:

The moist and fibrous texture of pumpkin pulp brings a different sensation with each touch. This uncertainty and novelty also stimulate children's desire to explore and their creativity. In this experiment, we put the pumpkin pulp in a sealed bag and add various small objects, not only allowing children to experience the joy of exploration but also helping them improve their fine sensory skills and problem-solving abilities.
